

Bangle Bag

Materials

DK yarn or thread, 2 x 3inch plastic bangles,
4.00mm hook

Notes

I inserted beads to make a pattern as I went along. If you do this, thread the beads on next. Alternatively, you could cross stitch a design on afterwards.

Directions

1st Side

Row 1: Ss yarn to bangle, 20dc on to bangle, turn. (20sts)

Row 2: 1ch, dc in each dc, turn.

Row 3: 1ch, dc in next 5dc, (2dc in next dc, dc in next 2dc) 4 times, dc in next 3dc, turn. (24sts)

Row 4: As Row 2.

Row 5: 1ch, dc in next 7dc, (2dc in next dc, dc in next 2dc) 4 times, dc in next 5dc, turn. (28sts)

Row 6: As Row 2.

Row 7: 1ch, dc in next 7dc, (2dc in next dc, dc in next 3dc) 4 times, dc in next 5dc, turn. (32sts)

Row 8: As Row 2.

Row 9: 1ch, dc in next 4dc, (2dc in next dc, dc in next 6dc) 4 times, turn. (36sts)

Row 10: As Row 2.

Row 11: 1ch, dc in next 12dc, (2dc in next dc, dc in next 11dc) twice, turn. (38sts)

Row 12: As Row 2.



Row 13: 1ch, dc in next 13dc, (2dc in next dc, dc in next 11dc) twice, dc in next dc, turn. (40sts)

Rows 14 & 15: As Row 2.
Fasten off.

2nd Side

Follow directions for 1st side. Do not fasten off, continue as follows.

Row 16: 1ch, dc in each dc across this side then across 1st side, ss to 1st ch, turn. (80sts)

Continue working on these 80 sts until bag is the size you want it. Fold in half and working through both sides together, dc in each dc, fasten off and sew in ends. (40 sts)
